

The Carroll County School District is located 50 miles west of Atlanta and is the 24th largest school system in the State of Georgia. The District offers premier educational opportunities to approximately 14,900 students throughout its 23 schools and two College and Career Academy sites.

Carroll County School System is the only district in the state to have two College and Career Academy campuses. Each campus offers 9 premier pathways of study to support the college and career readiness initiative of Carroll County Schools. In addition to programs offered at the CCA locations, all five high schools have Business and Computer Science, as well as Agriculture Education.

PREMIER ACTIVITIES

Carroll County School System offers eight premier organizations to challenge and engage the more than 3,000 students enrolled in career and technical program pathways. These programs provide numerous opportunities for students to compete at the state, region and national levels. During the 2016-2017 school year, students earned numerous awards and recognitions for their high performance and achievement.

Students earned 15 First Place wins at State Level Competition, 10 First Place wins at Region Competitions and 6 individuals advanced to National Competitions.

CTI

The Career and Technical Instruction support service is designed to assist students with disabilities enrolled in a career, technical and/or agricultural education program.

Carroll County students competed statewide through projects, exhibits and skill demonstrations. Two students earned second place awards.

FBLA

Georgia Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) is a nonprofit student organization committed to preparing today's students for success in business leadership. With over 50 years of experience, Georgia FBLA is the premier organization for student leaders.


